

CONCHO, ARIZONA


From Springerville: Starting north on Hwy 180/191 28.8 mi) via US-180 W/US-191 N to St Johns, turn right taking AZ-61 going towards Concho, turn right onto AZ-180A. Once you are on the AZ-180A, turn right at Mile Marker 352, follow the two-lane dirt road, turn right on Red Rock Ranch Road, turn left on Red Rock Lavender Road and drive down to Red Rock Vineyards Road to enter the parking lots located outside the entry gates.

Red Rock Lavender Farms

Red Rock Ranch and Farms has the distinction of being the first commercial lavender farm in Arizona.

The inspiration for a lavender farm came during a trip to Provence, France in1994 when the fields of lavender were in bloom.

With similar terrain, growing conditions, and wind conditions, it was decided to take a stab at growing lavender. It was interesting that in Provence they have similar wind conditions as we have in the White Mountains. They are called the Mistrals. While most other plants struggle in windy conditions, lavender is actually strengthened by the wind.

It is now a known fact that lavender grown at higher altitudes actually has beneficial qualities; the ester content of the flower is more intense at higher altitudes and the essential oil more prized.


